Progress

Payment Plan Eligibility

Payment plans are available for those who qualify. Qualification requirement: \$995.00 Deposit (Online Modules) and payment contract completed by the student with full signatures. Payment programs are zero interest and offer a tuition payment pro-rated over ten months. Payment is debited by IAEP, Inc. on the first of every month unless other contractually agreed upon in advance.

Post-Graduation

Students who graduate successfully from the AEP 2 program, are active alumni members, and awarded gold star status are eligible to enroll in the AEP 3 program. Students who have completed AEP 2 successfully are eligible to attend the practical AEP 2 courses the following year for a reduced rate per course (\$495.00 – Refresher fee). AEP 2 graduates are also eligible to attend any AEP 1 course for FREE as CPD. CPD merits a blue star status on the IAEP website. Attendance must be registered via email to the IAEP office 60 days prior to the course start date or sooner. Limited seating may apply. CPD at any AEP2 course is required for AEP 2 silver status within every 3 years.
